# **Bathing Water Status - Update**

All four sites proposed by Friends of the Dart, including the one at Stoke Gabriel, have been successful in getting through to consultation. Defra looked for views on whether any of the proposed sites should be added to the list of designated bathing waters.

i submitted a response, and Defra will now review the responses to the consultation before a final ministerial decision is made on whether any site should be designated as bathing water.





## Street Cleansing - Update

Your three District Councillors have been putting pressure on the Waste Team to improve how the council deals with the issues of litter and detritus we see everyday. Luke Rees, the Localities Case Manager, tells us that the Waste Team are currently undertaking a review of street cleansing; when that has been completed they should then be able to set expectations regarding sweeping for residents, towns and parishes more clearly.

At this time, some of the mechanical sweepers are older pieces of equipment that have been spending increased time out of action for maintenance and repairs; he tells us this review will also look at the forward fleet plan for this essential equipment and I have made it clear Stoke Gabriel should be included in any routes they plan.

### **Village Halls and Community Buildings Small Grants Fund**
